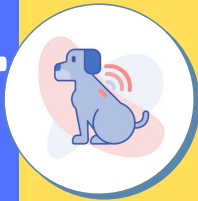
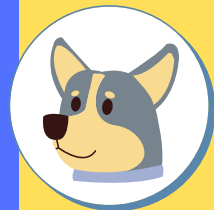


TOP TIPS TO

PREVENT PET THEFT



Get your pet microchipped and ensure your contact information is up-to-date.



It's a legal requirement that your dog wears a collar and a tag while out in public places. Make sure your details are kept up to date.



GPS pet trackers let you know your pets' whereabouts. Simply attach it to their collar so you can track your pet's location if they do go missing.



Avoid tagging your location on social media while out on walkies.



Make sure you always have recent photos of your pet. Photos and up-to-date descriptions of your pet will help you create posters or share on social media if they are lost or stolen.



If the worst should happen and your pet goes missing, report it on a national stolen pet website. You can also post in social media groups, on missing pet websites and contact your local veterinary practices.
