FOREWORD

Heart of Pitsea has been in existence since 2012 and was part of the Big Local project overseen by Local Trust. Having been identified as one of the most under-privileged areas of Basildon, a particular area of Pitsea was selected to receive over 1 million pounds to spend over a period of ten years to help develop the area in a variety of ways.

The main difference between this and other regeneration schemes was that all decisions about how to spend the money would be decided upon by local residents.

There were specified outcomes for the programme which centred on community cohesion, empowerment of local people, prioritising recognised needs and improving perceptions of the area.

Beginning with a steering group and a sequence of public meetings, eventually an official Partnership Board – led by residents – was formed to spearhead the project alongside representatives from organisations such as Essex Youth Services, Basildon Council, the NHS and Basildon, Billericay & Wickford Council for Voluntary Service, all on board to offer advice and support.

Having worked solidly for the past twelve years, overseeing all manner of positive changes to the area, the time has come for Heart of Pitsea as it stands to conclude its work. The £1,000,000 has been spent and we feel it is important to celebrate the achievements that have been made, acknowledge the many people and partners who have been part of this incredible journey and share the legacy of what has been set up for the future.

This publication will explore a lot of the great work which has been done to improve and invigorate Pitsea and the local community. Many connections have been made, friendships have been formed and the energy which the project has incited has been truly wonderful.

At the beginning we created a motivational statement which would hopefully encompass what we set out to do, namely: "We have a vision and our vision is for an engaged community that creates opportunities for everyone and feels good about itself." Looking at the multifarious activities and initiatives contained within this booklet, we hope you will agree that we have successfully achieved that.

Having been involved with Heart of Pitsea since its inception, I can honestly state that it has been a privilege to work alongside so many passionate local resident volunteers who have dedicated thousands of hours of their own time to make everything happen. It has been inspiring that the public have engaged with so many of our plans and been so generous and positive with their feedback.

Although the Heart of Pitsea itself is coming to an end, it is great that there are various legacy projects which will take the trailblazing work of HoP into the future. We are sincerely grateful to the National Lottery Community Fund for providing us with this unique opportunity to really make a difference.

To ensure the best opportunities came to our local community, we encouraged external organisations to apply for funding to deliver free projects in Pitsea.

We are proud to have funded over 42 external projects, including a social group for isolated adults, karate classes, self-defence training courses, dance sessions for children, selfawareness & safety classes, non-contact rugby for children, gangs' awareness training, oneto-one counselling, an inter-generational skills swap club, football coaching for young people, outdoor exercise workouts and skills for life training for young people with disabilities.

LITTLE MONSTERS & YOUTH YOUNITY

Another of Heart of Pitsea's proudest projects is our Youth Clubs.

Running every Wednesday from 4pm-5pm for 5-10 year olds and from 5.15pm-6.15pm for 11-17 year olds at Pitsea Leisure Centre, they are hugely popular, with around 50 fabulous members attending each week.

YOUTH YOUNIQUE GENERATION

Youth YOUnique Generation have been operating since 2015 and is the Heart of Pitsea's youth forum.



Using their own budget of £60,000, local young people aged 13-19 who wanted to make positive changes to the lives of young people in their community, have funded over 40 projects in Pitsea.



The forum has proved to be a unique platform for young people in the area who were prepared to devote their spare time to helping other young people achieve and flourish.

Just some of those projects the forum funded include free outdoor activities for young people during the Summer and outdoor events at the launch of the Legacy Park. They have also funded extra curricular projects at Northlands Primary School, bought the school a much-needed defibrillator and contributed £1500 towards educational materials for pupils stuck at home in quarantine during the pandemic who didn't have access to the internet.





They have funded a Christmas party for the Basildon & Pitsea Carnival Association, a Teen Gym at Pitsea leisure centre, Youth Market Challenges in Pitsea Market for youngsters to demonstrate their entrepreneurial skills, plus Internet Safety workshops and interactive dramas based around crime within schools.





Youth YOUnique Generation also supported the Heart of Pitsea A.C.T.I.O.N. programme by contributing funding for Internet Safety workshops and interactive dramas based around crime within schools.

CONTINUING OUR JOURNEY



In Pitsea

Although Heart of Pitsea will scale down now that our funding from the Big Lottery Community Fund is ending, we are incredibly excited to be working hard to bring a Men's Shed Hub to Pitsea.

We have a formed a new charity, with several of our existing resident members on board as trustees, to build the Men's Shed Hub. It will provide a space where men can connect, chat and create and where other community activities can take place.

How We Communicated

Keeping in touch with the local community and building friendships with residents has been hugely important to us.



Over the years we have delivered regular newsletters and information and event leaflets to residents within our boundary.

And we have conducted a number of community surveys and public consultations too.





Our website has been constantly updated and we have established a strong Facebook presence with over 2,200 followers - 1,460 living in Pitsea and Basildon.



But the most beneficial engagements have always been during face-to-face meetings with our lovely residents at our many events and pop-ups.







HOW WE SPENT OUR FUNDING

A million pounds is a lot of money to spend in 12 years.

To decide what to spend the money on, we surveyed the residents in our area to ask them what their priorities were. We did this 4 times throughout the past 12 years.

From the results of the early surveys, we came up with 4 objectives, Skills, Health, Community and Partnership.

Our money was split between the 4 objectives, then we went about looking for organisations and services that can deliver projects within those objectives for us.

After a few years and more surveying, we re-evaluated our themes and slimmed them down to 3 objectives, more broader themes of Health & Wellbeing activities, Safer and cleaner community, and Partnership.

The last small amount of money we have left will be given out in grants to continue our free youth clubs, crime awareness project, an inflatable fun day and the Pitsea Community Christmas event.


Every penny has been spent in Pitsea, and we hope many residents have benefited in some way.

HEART OF PITSEA RESIDENT SURVEY


Our final resident survey was conducted at end of 2023 and completed by 149 people, with the majority (86) living or working within the Heart of Pitsea boundary. This is particularly important to us as our lottery funding was given specifically to support residents in this area.

We wanted to see what impact, positive or negative, Heart of Pitsea has had in the community during the past 12 years. Below are some of the findings...


Have you seen or looked at the Heart of Pitsea?




Do you love where you live?
